Goals are established for individual children of each age group. * Nurturing program for parents and children - 12 week course with focus on child management and alternative child rearing practice advice, parenting skills education. * Emergency Intervention and Parent Aide Program - providing in home paraprofessional assistance to families in crisis that are referred by PAC or other agency. * Car Seat loaner Program also available.
